5. Public Comments

Mildred Martin- Showed flier that she had passed out in adjoining subdivision in Spanish and English stating that every single entrance to the subdivision would be closed.

Calvin Nelson- thought bus routes was already designated and was concerned for those who do business in the subdivision.

Consideration, discussion, and possible action – Ordinance No. 08-17-2020; An ordinance of the City Council of the City of Plum Grove, Texas, establishing the temporary closure of the following street intersections located within the city limits of the City of Plum Grove, Texas, in order to insure public safety and make improvements necessary to the general welfare of the public: (1) A portion of the intersection of County Road 3479 and County Road 347 South, also known as Paul Campbell Loop; (2) A portion of the intersection of County Road 5017, also known as Santa Rosa, and County Road 347 North, also known as Paul Campbell Loop; and (3) A portion of the intersection of Plum Grove Rd and County Road 5000, also known as San Marcos; containing findings and provisions relating to the subject; providing for severability; providing for repeal; providing for a penalty; and providing for an effective date.
